

CSF Fact Sheet

WHAT IS CSF?

CSF stands for the California Scholarship Federation, a statewide organization with chapters in high schools throughout California. Its purpose is to recognize outstanding scholastic achievement on the part of students.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

1. Because of the high standards of CSF, colleges and universities take special note and interest in CSF members.
2. ALL Lifetime (Sealbearer) members (Must be a member four of the last six semesters of one's high school career and one of those semesters must be during the senior year) are honored at a banquet given expressly for them each spring to publicly recognize their achievements.
3. Lifetime (Sealbearer) members receive special gold seals on their diplomas and gold cords and pins to wear with their graduation gown. They lead the graduating class into the graduation ceremony and are seated in the front rows and recognized at the graduation ceremony. They are among the first to receive their diplomas.
4. CSF awards a major competitive scholarship each year based on membership and sustained community service. This is the Seymour Memorial Award.

WHEN & HOW DO STUDENTS SIGN UP?

Signups for CSF members are held during the third week of each new semester and the dues are \$10.00. CSF applications are distributed through the English teachers and are returned to J2 when completed. Applications must be returned with a copy of the previous semester's grades.
