

Clovis West Freshman Registration Directions – Step by Step

Step 1 – Complete the Emergency Information.

Step 2 – Parents and Students are to sign. If student does not get parent signature, the counselor will choose their courses.

Step 3 – Student is to state the *reason* for taking summer-school. Make sure to list the course which is Health.

Step 4 – Student must circle *one* class for *each category* in English, Math, PE, Health

- Most students will circle English 9-P.
 - Student will circle English 9 Honors if he/she *automatically qualifies* for the course (cumulative 3.5 GPA/”A” grade in AB class/teacher recommendation.)
 - Circle English 9 – P if student *plans to take the English 9 Honor test*. Student will be added to the honor course if he/she passes the placement test.
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- All students in Math 8 will circle Math 1.
 - All students in Adv. Math 8 will circle Math 2. (Students in Adv. Math 8 will take a test to determine placement into Math 2 Honors.)
 - Students who failed Math 8 may be placed into a Math Lab for support.
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- *All* students circle PE Core B (Students in sports or cheer will be placed into their correct athletic PE later, *if* they play a sport.)
 - All Band and Color-guard students *must* circle PE Core B *and* PE Band.
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- Most students circle Health/Geography.
 - Students who take Health over the summer, do not circle Health.

Step 5 – Student must circle at least *one* class in *either* Science or World Language.

- Student *must be strong academically* to enroll in *both* Science and World Language.
 - Students in Math 1 typically enroll in Science 1; however, students strong academically with a high B or A average could enroll in Biology.
 - Students enrolled in Math 2 enroll in either Biology or Biology Honors.
 - Students enrolled in Math 2 Honors may take Chemistry.
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- Student must have at least a 2.5 GPA to enroll in World Language.
 - Student fluent and a native Spanish speaker may enroll in Native Speaker class.
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Step 6 – If student has room in their schedule, they may circle an elective in one of the listed categories.

- The AP Human Geography course is reserved for the very top student, only a handful of freshman students will be allowed to take the course.
- The Auto course requires student to be mature and responsible.

Step 7 – Students must list alternative courses in case a class gets full.

- Student who is running for Leadership, Peer Counseling, Collaborative Mentor, or Yearbook must list an elective listed on the form. Student is to list one of the aforementioned courses as an alternate. If the student is selected, the elective will be replaced by Leadership, etc.
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- Summer-school registration will occur at the same time as the registration form is turned in.
 - Only students meeting the district criteria may take summer-school.
 - The course taken by freshman is the Health course.
 - A typical student schedule consists of 6 classes – English, Math, PE, Health/Geography and then, 2 more classes.
